That being said, I also feel like there is a diminishing return on investment when it comes to very high end bikes. much like TVs and PCs I bought this bike for my 7 year old son. Hes above average in bike handling skills. He didnt take very good care of it so I figured Id buy one of these as they had shimano parts but still were a reputable brand. He wanted a mountain bike to try to ride trails and stuff with me. When i got this bike I was very disappointed. Theres nothing special about this bike over walmart bikes. I was hoping getting the bike from a direct brand new trend in the bike industry would yield a better bike at the same pricepoint. I first noticed the bike had a threaded headset. Not a dealbreaker but very heavy and cheap. Looking at the saddle, handlebar, stems and crankset I found it to be of very cheap quality and heavy. Weight matters much more on kids bikes as they are very heavy compared to body weight. The tires were very hard and wore out very quickly. Of course a kid is going to skid.

Before I could yell at him to stop, one 3ft skid wore the tire down past the tread. His rear tire is completely done after riding it to school and back less than a mile round trip for a couple months. The wheels and cranks develop play in the cup and cone bearings. Ive had to regrease and adjust them a couple times. The front shock has had all the coating worn off the stanchions from normal use. The fork barely telescopes due to the amount of wear and pitting. Ive cleaned it several times and tried to fix the large grooves but it still binds in normal use. Not to mention the bike in person is very ugly with the comically large downtube. He now thinks that he doesnt take care of the bike very well because of all the problems weve had with it. Hes learned a lesson here that will be a valuable life lesson. He now appreciates nice things and treats them well. Better then most offerings at your local goods store. Its a great little bike, especially for the price, simply cant beat it. Im not mechanically inclined, but was able to assemble it, adjust the factory installed breaks and my kid was out riding within 35 min of me opening the box. Very smooth Shimano 7 speed shifter, solid breaks, Im estimating it weighs 2829.5 lbs and the 450 dollar trek was 24lbs. But for 140 bucks its not s big deal. Fits my 44 inch tall 7 year old just fine. For the money I am very happy with the bike. Assembly was easy and only took me a few minutes to do. Ive built a few bikes over the years so I knew what I was doing. I felt the instructions were adequate regardless. Theres instructions for a few different types of bikes, just follow yours along. If youre mechanically inclined but have never built a bike before, I recommend you give it a try and save yourself from paying someone to assemble it for you. Every tool you need for assembly comes in the box, minus a phillips screwdriver for attaching the reflectors. Its not that hard at all.

The only parts I could see someone getting hung up at is adjusting the brakes and the rear derailleur as I found out on my bike. My rear derailleur was off a little. The bike was clicking and would not shift gears. I found a video on YouTube and had it running perfect in about 2 minutes. I also found videos for adjusting the brakes. Things to note Ive seen in other bike reviews Regarding the hand brake levers, they come with adjustment screws that allow you to get the lever closer to the bar so children with smaller hands will be able to actuate the lever if they have the hand strength. Does not come with a kickstand. Be careful what you buy. Its too long. Bike actually has 7 gears, not 6 like stated. Does not have a water bottle cage mount. Youll need to get one that bolts to the seat post or handlebars if you want one. I was not concerned by the weight like some of the other negative reviews. After putting together the seat, handle, front wheel, and pedals I had issues with the brakes rubbing the rim. Still having issues, especially the wheels not being remotely true. Since it was

purchased from Amazon, DiamondBack would not stand behind their product. The best they could do was suggest taking a new bike to the shop and would not be able to reimburse me since it was sold by Amazon. The return thru Amazon was way more difficult than it needed to be. First time buying a bike online due to my son being between sizes, but sticking local next time. This minimises the chances of it getting released accidentally. Disc brakes use 2 pads and these are usually kept in place with packing pieces during transit. Ensure all screws are tightened. There's no doubt that a certain amount of equipment can improve cycling safety, particularly at night. On the other hand, however much equipment you have, there's no substitute for cycling skills see page 10 and a full awareness of other traffic. When you buy a cycle helmet, it's important to check that it's manufactured to a proper standard. The minimum legal requirement for any helmet sold in the UK and the rest of Europe is that they are CE certified and conform to the EN10781997 European Standard. Once a helmet has been in an accident, it must be replaced. The shell may have been weakened and the liner will be less able to absorb shocks. Remember that some manufacturers offer free replacement of crash damaged helmets. LIGHTS Fitting for suspension forks. 8 As for lights, you must have a front and rear light marked to show that they comply with British Standard. Legally, you must not fit a flashing light to a bike, though you can fit one to your clothing if you wish to. Only a few LED lights produce enough light to comply with the British Standard, even when they're in the nonflashing mode. This means they can only be used as a supplement to British Standard lights and mustn't be used on their own. If you find yourself fitting new batteries too often, consider fitting rechargeable lights or a dynamo. Your Diamondback Retailer will advise. Select one that feels comfortable and secure, that fits well down on your forehead and which has straps that lie well away from your ears. Check frequently that your lights are as bright as they should be. The batteries in particular need changing frequently, so keep spares at home and at work.

When replacing bulbs, especially halogen ones, don't touch the glass at all. Once you've got a good fit, adjust the straps carefully, making sure that the adjusters sit well below the ears and don't get twisted. Many helmets also have an adjustable nape strap at the back of the helmet. Follow manufacturers' instructions. Good lighting should be backed up by other visibility aids. If a bright yellow reflective jersey is too much for you, wear a reflective belt, preferably one that goes round waist and shoulders. They're very effective at letting motorists know you're on the road. To get a good fit, helmets have either an exterior adjuster, simple pads or inflatable side pieces. Once adjusted, hold the helmet upside down with the straps out of the way to make it easier to put on. You can also fit reflective material to the bike itself. Large areas are best but even small strips make you more visible. It'll stick better if you clean any grease or oil off the frame before fitting. Try to blend the reflective areas in with the shape of the bike. LED bike lights usually have a clip so you can attach them to your clothing. There is also a switch to select a steady or a flashing light. They should

only be fitted as a backup to a legal light, or to a dynamo. Most LED lights have a closefitting plastic case. To fit new batteries, find the notch in the case and prise the two halves apart with a screwdriver. There is no bulb as such. When putting the case back together, take care to avoid damaging or moving the rubber seal. When conditions are really bad or an area is particularly congested be prepared to walk your bike around roundabouts and difficult right turns. **WARNING** There is a risk of injury to the rider and to others if all necessary repairs and adjustments are not made. Take every precaution to ensure safe riding. **RIDING IN THE DARK BEFORE RIDING** Again, take extra care in the dark. Make sure your signals are in good time, so motorists are aware of your intentions.

If you have any problems refer them to your Diamondback Retailer at once. Make sure you are able to use your gears and brakes effectively and that you can handle your bicycle safely in traffic. To familiarise yourself with the many rules of the road, Diamondback recommend you obtain a current copy of the Highway Code, available from Post Offices and most good bookshops. Parents are urged not to let their children onto busy roads until they are experienced cyclists. Indeed, all new or inexperienced cyclists are strongly recommended to take a training course in cycling. Details may be obtained from schools, council offices or Police stations. Make sure you can see and be seen front and rear lights, a rear reflector, pedal and wheel reflectors are legal requirements. They should conform to British Standard BS6102. Carry spare bulbs and batteries if needed. Light coloured and reflective clothing will help you to be seen ask to see the range stocked by your Diamondback Retailer. They distract your attention from the traffic around you and prevent you from hearing approaching danger. **AFTER YOUR FIRST FEW RIDES** All the nuts and bolts on your bicycle beddown in the first few weeks of use, we recommend you regularly check your bike as per the maintenance section on page 33. **ANTICIPATION** The most important general riding skills you need to develop are keeping track of what other road users are doing and working out what they are going to do next. That way you can position yourself safely on the road and let them know, by your road position, what you are going to do next. Do not follow too closely behind other road vehicles or other cyclists and avoid riding up the inside of traffic queues. Make use of "cycle lanes" where they are provided. Always concentrate and keep a good grip on the handlebars at all time in case you suddenly need to steer out of harms way. **RIDING IN BAD WEATHER** Always take extra care when the weather is wet, foggy, windy or icy.
