Our upper teeth should overlap with the lower ones, but when the space is too small or too large, problems start to arise. Bites are the most common problem of bites. People who suffer from underbites often report problems with chewing, tension in teeth and jaw muscles, and even difficulty speaking. Untreated bites all carry the same potential ailments as bites, but with some more amplified ailments: earache, joint pain, excessive wear of tooth enamel, and tooth decay. Rather than a proper bite, where the upper teeth fit comfortably above the lower teeth with a very light bite, a cross bite or underbite occurs when the lower teeth protrude beyond the upper teeth, either in the front or back teeth. A cross bite occurs when one or more of the lower teeth protrudes past the upper teeth. There are two types of cross bites: front and rear. The anterior transverse bites affect about 4-5% of the population. They can be treated with orthodontic care, but for severe cases in adults, some crossbites require a combination of orthodontic care and surgery to move the lower jaw back for optimal results. Rear cross bites Rear cross bites are an improper bite on the back of the teeth: the lower posterior teeth (pre-molars and molars) protrude farther than the upper lower teeth. The cross bite may occur only on one side of the mouth, or on both sides. Rear crossbites are more common, affecting about 16% of the population, and can also be corrected with a common orthodontic device called an expander. Subbite vs. Bite A lower bite is another way of describing a cross bite. The lower front teeth protrude beyond the upper teeth, creating an inappropriate bite, or lower bite. In a healthy smile with a correct bite, it is a very small bite: the upper teeth overlap slightly with the lower ones, and all the teeth join together when the bite is closed. With a lower bite, the opposite is true, leading to malocclusion, or bad bite. The lower bite may occur in the front teeth (front cross bite), or rear teeth (back cross bite), or both. Overbite vs Crossbite/Underbite In one bite and in a well-aligned smile, there will be a small overbite: the upper teeth will overlap with the lower ones, and the rows of teeth will settle comfortably when the bite is closed.
