Register online via the OSS (Online Single Submission) system 2. Create an account and fill out the registration form 3. Get a Business Identification Number (NIB) 4. Upload the required documents to the OSS system 5. Apply for a specific business permit 6. Wait for the verification process by the relevant department 7. Attend field inspections if necessary 8. Receive electronic business permits through the OSS system 9. Download and print the business license as an official document. Via offline, including: The procedure for making a business permit offline can be done directly at the nearest Trade Office by following these steps: 1. Take the registration form provided by the Trade Office. 2. Fill out the SIUP registration form completely. 3. Include the required documents. 4. Photocopy the form 2 times. 5. Prepare the costs for making a business license. 6. If the form and requirements are complete, submit them to the Trade Office officer. 6. Wait about 2 weeks until the SIUP is ready to be issued. The officer will contact the applicant when the business license has been issued. In any case, you might want your cleaning company to be licensed and bonded, as government and corporate clients will expect this. Tobacco Licenses If you sell cigarettes or other tobacco products, you will need to be licensed. Just like alcohol, the sale of tobacco products is very tightly regulated, and you will need to ensure you're compliant.Even if you don't sell tobacco itself, you are also likely to require licenses if you sell related items—mfor example, vaping products, cannabis edibles or other paraphernalia.10. Health Permits and Licenses Many types of businesses need health permits to ensure they're taking the right precautions to keep the public and their employees safe. In addition to food businesses, organizations like tattoo parlors, waste haulers, breweries and similar will also need health permits.What type of health permits might my business need? Health permits and licenses come in many different types, including:Occupational licenses if you're providing healthcare services; for example, as a physician, therapist, dentist or similar.Hygiene-related permits if you're selling products that may be consumed, such as food or beverages.Businesses that provide services where health is an important consideration, such as daycare centers, spas, swimming pools, tattoo parlors and similar.11. Fire Inspections and Permits In many cases, especially if your business is open to the public, your premises must be inspected to ensure you meet fire prevention regulations.Does my business require a fire inspection permit? Your business will typically need to be inspected for fire safety if:It is open to the public.You employ people on your premises.Many municipalities require fire permits for all types of businesses, although some home-based businesses may be exempt. Check with your local fire marshal on permitting laws in your city or state.13. Beauty Salon and Cosmetologist Licenses If you operate or work in a spa beauty salon, you must be licensed by your state. There are separate licensing requirements depending on your type of work, such as barber, hairdresser, manicurist or cosmetologist.Many states require you to have a minimum number of hours of training or schooling to obtain a license.14. Building, Planning and Zoning Permits If you want to operate a business in a particular area or you want to develop or alter property, you will typically need the relevant building, planning or zoning permit. These vary between regions and cities, so contact your local government office to find out more.When might I need a building, planning or zoning permit? Common situations where you may need a permit include:If you are making substantial renovations, improvements or expansions to a property.If you are undergoing new construction or demolishing an existing building.If you are changing the use of land between residential, commercial or industrial.Other Federal Laws and Requirements Of course, you'll need to stay up to date with your taxes.
