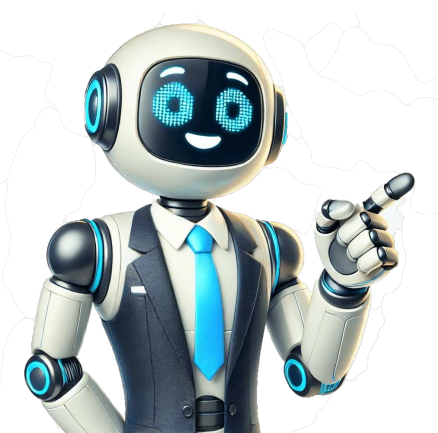

Looking for the Dublin postcodes and zip codes? I lived in Dublin for a year which helped me to understand the mail delivery system, postcodes and the format on how to address an international letter to Ireland. Postcodes and zip codes can seem confusing as each country has their own system. In simple terms, both zip codes and postcodes serve the same purpose, it is just called in a different way. Ireland uses the Eircode (like a postcode) which is specific to Ireland. Eircodes in Ireland are unique in a way that they indicate the exact address of the individual or company, down to the level of the street number. The Irish postcodes have 7 characters and are alphanumeric, meaning that they include both numbers and letters. When formatting the Dublin postcodes, the most important is that they have two parts: Routing Key (eg. D02) and a Unique Identifier (eg. N725). The Routing Key marks a wider geographic location within Dublin. While the Unique Identifier specifies the exact address of the person. So, here is everything you need to know about the Dublin postcodes (Eircodes), and how to address a letter to Ireland! Street Signs in Ireland You might be wondering, what is the difference between postal codes and zip codes? They have the same role but just described by a different name. Both zip codes and postal codes serve the same purpose, which is to make mail delivery more efficient and accurate. Ireland uses Eircodes, which are alphanumeric and unique to Ireland. Unlike zip codes, which are numeric and used in the United States, Eircodes are alphanumeric and specific to Ireland. Thus, the Dublin postcodes (or Eircodes) have 7 characters and are split into two parts. Dublin has 22 postal districts and each postal district marks the first part of the Eircode (the Routing Key). The Dublin postal districts start with letter D, and then numbered. E.g. D01, D02, or D03. Then, the second part of a Dublin Eircode (postcode) is the Unique Identifier. It is 4 characters and it defines the specific address of an individual or business. Eg. K203 Thus, an example of a Dublin postal code (Eircode) is D02 K303 for the National Gallery of Ireland, Dublin, Ireland. There are many postcodes (Eircodes) in Dublin and it is not possible to list them all, but here are some examples of Dublin postal codes. The first part of the Dublin postcode list goes from D01-D24 (with some numbers excluded), then the second part (4 characters) are added to specify the address. The first part (routing keys) of the Dublin postcodes are: D01, D02, D03, D04, D05, D06, D6W, D07, D08, D09, D10, D11, D12, D13, D14, D15, D16, D17, D18, D20, D22, D24. Once you add the second part (unique identifier) to the postcode, there is a high number of postcodes in Dublin, especially as you have a unique postcode in Dublin down to the individual address! D01 is the first part of the postcode, and then it is followed by 4 characters (numbers and letters) to specify the exact address. For example, D01 Y981 for Fibber Fages, 82 Parnell Street, Dublin 1, Ireland. D02 is the second part of the postcode, and then it is followed by 4 characters (numbers and letters) to specify the exact address. An example of a Dublin 2 postal code is D02 K303 for the National Gallery of Ireland, Dublin 2, Ireland. D07 is in North Dublin but not too far from the city center. It includes places such as the Old Jameson Distillery Museum (Smithfield), Phippsboro, Cabra, and Four Courts. D07 is the first part of the postcode, and then it is followed by 4 characters (numbers and letters) to specify the exact address. An example of a Dublin 7 postal code is D07 V57C for the Old Jameson Distillery Museum, Bow Street, Dublin 7, Ireland. Guinness Storehouse, Dublin The postal code for Dublin 8 is marked as D08 (routing key). D08 is in South Dublin, but close to the city center. It includes areas such as Portobello, Dolphins Barn, Inchicore, and Kilmahain. Famous places to visit in Dublin 8 include the Kilmahain Gaol Museum, Guinness Storehouse, Irish Museum of Modern Art, Christchurch Cathedral, St. Patrick's Cathedral, and Vicar Street. D08 is the first part of the postcode, and then it is followed by 4 characters (numbers and letters) to specify the exact address.
